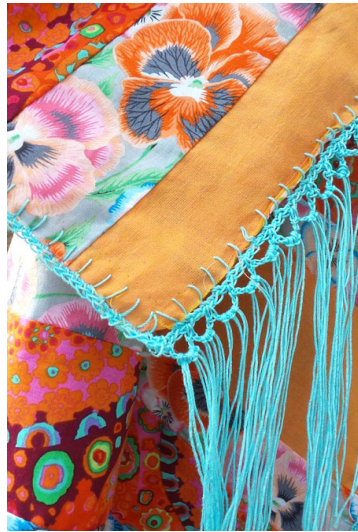


# Summer Shawl

## YOU WILL NEED

- 0.75m of voile - cut along the fold, sew ends together to make a long strip
- 3 x 0.5m of different contrasting fabrics - cut into various widths of strips from 2" - 3½"
- 1 ball Rico Crochet Cotton
- 3mm crochet hook



## TIP

Use a walking foot and increase the stitch length to accommodate the different thickness.

## PATTERN

Use the voile as your foundation piece (backing fabric). Starting at 1 end place your first strip with wrong sides together – on top of this strip place your next strip, right sides together and sew using a ¼" seam along the length – press open place your next strip right sides together and repeat along the length of your voile until the end.

Trim edges to neaten.

Using the longest stitch length on your machine baste all the way around your finished piece. This will keep your work stable whilst you do your blanket stitch edge.

Stitch around your fabric with blanket stitch, then double crochet into the stitches. At each narrower end, double crochet into first double crochet, 4 chain, miss 2 double crochet, double crochet into next, repeat to end.

Add your fringing to the narrower ends, cut approx. 8" length of crochet cotton for the fringes.

Finished shawl measures 1.5m + length of fringe.
